FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

Test was spudded May 3, 1949 and a 17½" hole was out to depth of 167'. A string of 48# National Seamless 13-3/8" casing was cemented with 175 sacks at a depth of 163'. Plug was pumped down at 6:00 P.M. May 3, 1949. Total casing in hole is 148 feet.

We propose to allow cement a set time of 24 hours then test casing for satisfactory cement job. If same is found to be OK, drilling will be resumed.
