Dear Sirs:

Effective January 1, 1972 the captioned well was reclassified from the Blinebry Oil Pool to the Blinebry Gas Pool. Under date of January 31, 1972, the Commission issued Administrative Order NSP-859 authorizing an 80-acre non-standard gas proration unit comprising the N/2 SW/4 of Sec. 14, T-21-S, R-37-E to be dedicated to Eubanks No. 3. It further was stipulated that the Order would be effective the date J. R. CONE Eubanks Well No. 2, located in Unit L of said Section 14 was shut in.

This is to advise you that the Blinebry zone in Eubanks Well No. 2 was shut in January 1, 1972; and it is our intention that the said zone shall remain shut in, so long as Order NSP-859 is in effect.

Further, we request authority to commingle the liquid production from the Blinebry zone in Eubanks Well No. 3 with the oil produced from the Blinebry Oil Pool in J. R. CONE Eubanks Wells No. 1 and 4, respectively located in Units M and N of Section 14, T-21-S, R-37-E, Lea County, New Mexico. It is anticipated that Blinebry liquid recovery from Eubanks Well No. 3 will approximate 15 barrels per day, and we would appreciate the liquid allocation being set initially at that figure.

March 22, 1972, Form C-104 was filed with the Oil Conservation Commission in Hobbs requesting authority for El Paso Natural Gas Company to transport high pressure gas from the Blinebry zone in Eubanks Well No. 3. J. R. Cone has installed two-stage separation equipment to process liquid production associated therewith. It is our understanding that, effective April 4, 1972, El Paso will be prepared to initiate production of the Blinebry Gas zone in Eubanks Well No. 3.

Effective January 1, 1972 the mentioned well was reclassified from the Blinney Oil Pool to the Blinney Gas Pool. Under Order of January 21, 1972, the Division issued Administrative Order 82-832 authorizing a 30-acre non-standard gas production area consisting the W/2 SW/4 of Sec. 14, T-21-S, R-37-E to be allocated to Eubanks No. 3. It further was stipulated that the Order would be effective the date U. R. COME Eubanks Well No. 3, located in Unit 4 of said Section 14 was shut in.

It is to advise you that the Blinney zone in Eubanks Well No. 3 was shut in January 1, 1972, and it is our intention that the said well remain shut in, so long as Order 82-832 is in effect.

Further, we request authority to combine the liquid production from the Blinney zone in Eubanks Well No. 3 with the oil produced from the Blinney Oil Pool to U. R. COME Eubanks Wells No. 1 and 2, respectively located in Units 4 and 5 of Section 14, T-21-S, R-37-E, Las Alamos, New Mexico. It is anticipated that Blinney liquid recovery from Eubanks Well No. 3 will contribute to overall gas recovery, and we would appreciate the liquid allocation being set initially at that figure.

Form 22, 1972, Form C-104 was filed with the Oil Conservation Commission in Hobbs requesting authority for El Paso Natural Gas Company to transport high pressure gas from the Blinney zone in Eubanks Well No. 3. U. R. COME has installed two stage separation equipment to process liquid production associated therewith. It is our understanding that, effective April 4, 1972, El Paso will be required to institute production of the Blinney Gas zone in Eubanks Well No. 3.
