Total Depth 332' red bed. Ran 7 jts. 13-3/8" OD 36# Spiral Weld casing and 1 jt 13-3/8" OD 48# 8R H-40 SS casing, 313.05' set at 330.34' and cemented with 350 sax. Cement circulated. Plug was down at 11:30 A.M., December 17, 1950. Cement was allowed to set 24 hours, 1000# pressure was applied with all valves closed with no drop in pressure during a 30 minute period. Test was made prior to and after drilling plug.
