MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON VILIS

1. The first step in the process of identifying and assessing the risk of a chemical substance is to determine whether the substance is likely to be present in the environment. This is done by reviewing the available information on the substance, including its physical and chemical properties, its uses, and its potential for release into the environment. If the substance is found to be present in the environment, the next step is to assess the risk of exposure to the substance. This is done by comparing the estimated exposure to the substance with the known or suspected adverse effects of the substance. If the exposure is found to be high enough to cause adverse effects, the substance is considered to be a risk to human health and the environment. The final step in the process is to develop and implement measures to reduce the risk of exposure to the substance. This may involve controlling the use of the substance, reducing the release of the substance into the environment, or providing information to the public about the risks of the substance.
