Gentlemen:

THEMCO Inc. hereby makes application for approval of a 160-acre non-standard gas production unit in the Sunset Gas Pool comprised of the NE¹/₄ of Section 17, T-2S-R, R-37-E, Los County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states the following:

1. THEMCO Inc. is owner and operator of the Little Weatherly Lease comprising 160 acres covering the NE¹/₄ of Section 17, T-2S-R, R-37-E, Los County, New Mexico, as shown on the attached plat and proposes that this quarter section be established as a 160-acre non-standard gas production unit in the Sunset Gas Pool in accordance with Rule 9(b) of Order R-520 for the Sunset Gas Pool.

2. THEMCO Inc. is owner and operator of the Little Weatherly Well No. 4 located in Unit "E", 1950 feet from the north line and 600 feet from the west line of Section 17, T-2S-R, R-37-E, Los County, New Mexico. The well is currently being completed in the Sunset Gas Pool and this well will be used as the unit well.

3. The proposed non-standard gas production unit will meet the requirements of Rule 9(b) of Order R-520, Sunset Gas Pool, as follows:

- (a) The unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
- (b) The unit lies wholly within a governmental section.
- (c) The entire unit may reasonably be presumed to be production of gas.
- (d) The length or width of the unit does not exceed 3200 feet.

Gentlemen:

TEXACO Inc. hereby makes application for approval of a 160-acre non-standard gas production unit in the Las Alamos Gas Pool, Section 17, T-21-S, R-37-E, Las Alamos, New Mexico, and in support thereof states the following:

1. TEXACO Inc. is owner and operator of the Little Westbury Lease containing 160 acres covering the NW 1/4 of Section 17, T-21-S, R-37-E, Las Alamos, New Mexico, as shown on the attached plat and proposed unit. This quarter section is established as a 160-acre non-standard gas production unit in the Las Alamos Gas Pool in accordance with Rule 2(d) or 2(e) of the New Mexico Gas Pool.

2. TEXACO Inc. is owner and operator of the Little Westbury Well No. 1 located in Unit "E", 1960 feet from the north line and 660 feet from the west line of Section 17, T-21-S, R-37-E, Las Alamos, New Mexico. The well is currently being completed in the Las Alamos Gas Pool and this well will be used as the unit well.

3. The proposed non-standard gas production unit will meet the requirements of Rule 2(d) or 2(e) of Order H-25, Las Alamos Gas Pool, as follows:

- (a) The unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
- (b) The unit lies wholly within a governmental section.
- (c) The entire unit may reasonably be expected to be production of gas.
- (d) The length or width of the unit does not exceed 200 feet.

- (e) By copy of this letter of application, all operators owning interests in the section in which the unit is located and all operators owning interests within 1900 feet of the unit well are notified by registered mail of the intent of TEXACO Inc. to form the proposed non-standard gas proration unit. (Addressee list on attached plat.)

Based upon the facts recited above, TEXACO Inc. respectfully requests that the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission approve administratively the non-standard gas proration unit described above.

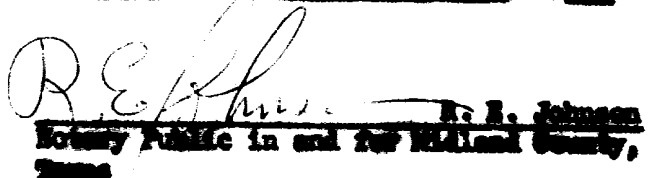

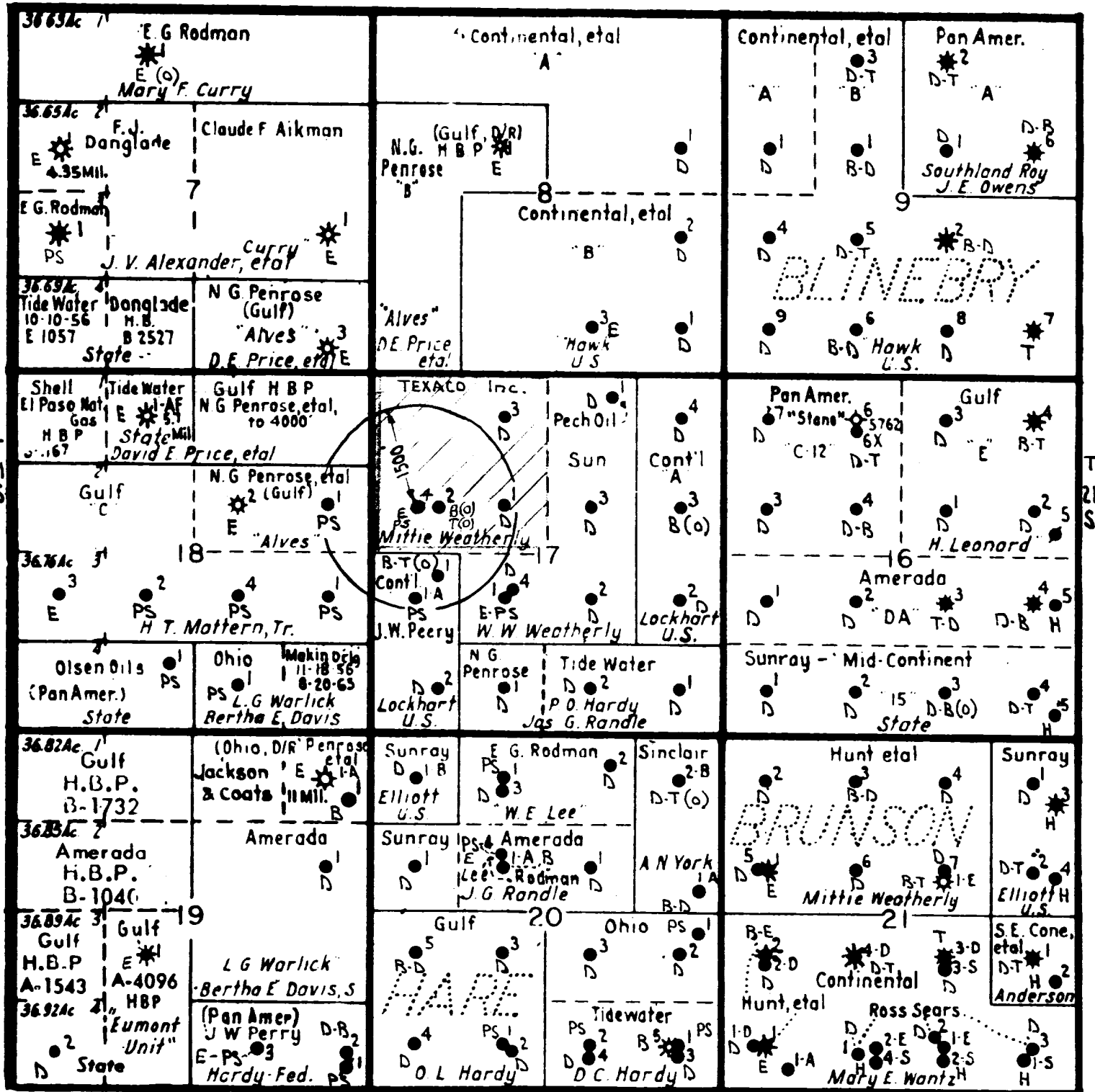
