DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

The Drinkard formation in this well was treated by The Chemical Process Company through casing perforations 6510 to 6628 feet by injecting 500 gallons Form Jel followed by 5000 gallons 15% low surface tension hydrochloric acid.

On April 19 & 20, six days after treatment, the Drinkard Zone flowed 71.5 barrels clean oil in 24 hours through 30/64-inch tubing choke. Flowing tubing pressure 60 psig. Gas-oil ratio 2579.

The average daily oil capacity of the well before treatment was 50 barrels.
