APPLICATION

Applicant, N. B. Hunt, for himself and on behalf of Lamar Hunt and W. H. Hunt, hereby applies to the Commission pursuant to Rule 5 of the Commission's Order No. R-520 issued on August 12, 1954, in Case No. 673, for an order approving a non-standard gas proration unit in the Eumont Gas Pool comprising the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of the $S\frac{1}{2}$ of Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, as reflected on the plat attached hereto and marked Exhibit A, containing 160 acres, more or less.

In support of this application, Applicant states:

1. That Applicant, N. B. Hunt, Lamar Hunt and W. H. Hunt are the present owners of all operating rights in the proposed non-standard gas proration unit.

2. That Continental Oil Company, a predecessor in interest of Applicant, has heretofore drilled the Mary E. Wantz No. 1 Well in accordance with the rules and regulations then in effect, at a

location approximately 660 feet from the West line and 660 feet from the South line of Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and completed the same as a commercial well productive of oil from the Penrose Skelly pool.

3. That the Oil Conservation Commission of the State of New Mexico notified Applicant by letter dated March 7, 1955, that this well should be re-classified as a gas well in the Eumont Pool.

4. That the proposed non-standard gas proration unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.

5. That the proposed non-standard gas proration unit lies wholly within Section 21, Township 21 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico.

6. That in the opinion of Applicant the entire proposed non-standard gas proration unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas.

7. That the length or width of the proposed non-standard gas proration unit does not exceed 5,280 feet.

8. That Applicant has on March 24, 1955, notified (a) operators owning interests in Sec. 21, T.21 S., R. 37 E., N.M.P.M., Lea County, New Mexico, and (b) operators owning interests within 1,500 feet of the Mary E. Wantz Well No. 1, of Applicant's intent to form such non-standard gas proration unit by sending copies of this application via

9. That triplicate copies of New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission's Gas Well Plats reflecting the data applicable to the proposed non-standard gas proration unit are attached hereto as a part of this application.

WHEREFORE, Applicant requests that he be granted an order approving a non-standard gas proration unit in the circumstances above described, and for such other and further relief as appear warranted in the premises.

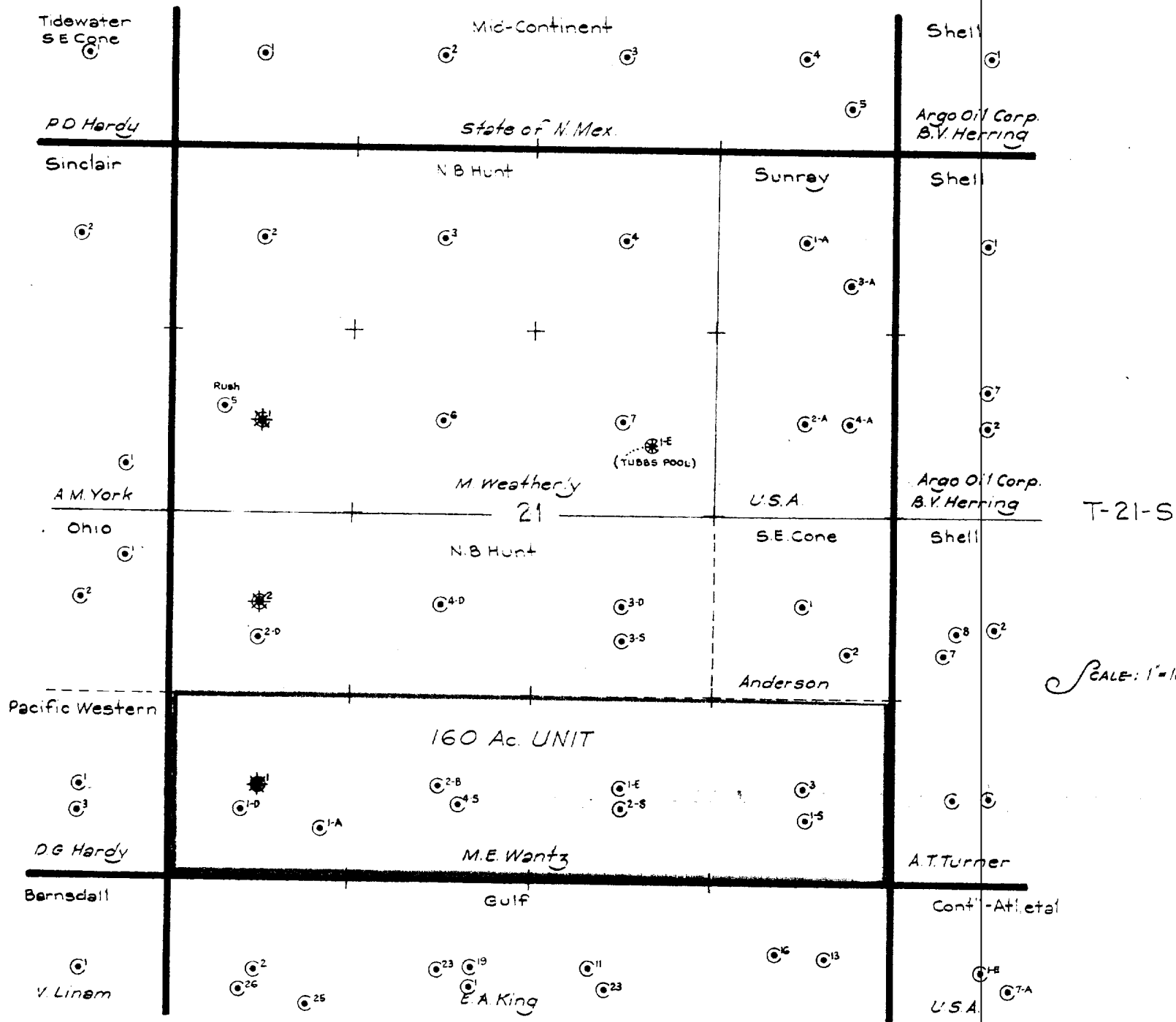
