## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

At 8 A.M. March 19, 1939, 72 hours had elapsed, at which time we tested 9 5/8" OD new casing set at 1365' and cemented with 400 sacks.

The test was conducted in the following manner; built up 1000 # pressure, closed valves and held for 30 minutes. Tested OK Plug was drilled, 1000 # pressure again applied, valves were closed and pressure held for 30 minutes. Tested OK.

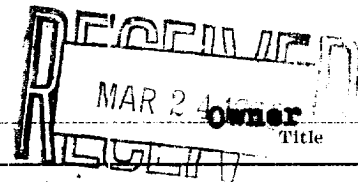
