REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE
IN RESPONSE TO A RESOLUTION OF THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

The following is a summary of the report of the Commissioner of the General Land Office, in response to a resolution of the House of Representatives, passed May 1, 1890, relating to the disposal of the public lands.
