Dear Sir:

We have a letter from Mr. R. F. Montgomery, your  
Proration Manager at Hobbs, referring to our Ethel Shipley  
Owens Well No. 1, Sec. 26 T. 22-S. R. 36-E., Lea County, New  
Mexico. Mr. Montgomery states that we must obtain a connec-  
tion for the sale of casinghead gas, or secure a no-flare  
order from the Commission not later than 7-24-57 for this well.

We, hereby, ask that an exception to the "No-Flare  
Order" be granted for our Ethel Shipley Owens Well No. 1.  
The lease on which this well is situated covers the southwest  
quarter of Sec. 26, T. 22-S, R. 36-E., Lea County, New Mexico.

Since completing Well No. 1 on this lease Wells  
Nos. 2 and 3 have been completed as producers and Well No. 4  
is being drilled at present.

On May 24, 1957 our Company wrote to United Carbon  
Co., Inc. asking that they connect their gas transmission  
line to our Owens Lease and purchase the casinghead gas pro-  
duced by this Lease.

Our Assistant Division Manager, Mr. L. G. Marshall,  
at Houston, received a reply from United Carbon, dated June 27,  
1957, in which they refused to make a gas connection. We en-  
close a photostatic copy of this reply.

You will note that United Carbon suggests we wait  
until the 4th well is completed on this lease, at which time

will meet further ~~1967~~ and then again discuss a contract.

The volume of gas to be flared from Well No. 1 is approximately 20 M.C.F. per day. The Gas-Oil ratio of Well No. 1 is 100/1.

The distance from United Carbon's gathering system to the Lewis Lease is approximately 2-1/2 miles.

We enclose a plat showing the well locations, the offset ownership and location of the tank battery.

Dear Mr. Burrell:

Referring to our previous correspondence in regard to the casinghead gas you were developing in the Southwest Quarter of Section 26, T22S, R36E, Lea County, New Mexico, I have just been advised by our Field Superintendent that tests have been made on the two wells you now have completed on this tract and the H<sub>2</sub>S content is 138 grains per 100 cubic feet. This is too sour for us to take into our treated gas line which is the only line we have near this lease. Our Superintendent also reported that the two wells were only making approximately 40 MCF per day.

We understand that you plan to drill two more wells on this lease, and I would suggest that we wait until this lease is fully developed, at which time we will make another test and then we will be in a better position to discuss a contract.
