Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation respectfully requests that the Oil Conservation Commission grant an exception to No-Flare Order R-553 insofar as it pertains to Gulf's J. F. Janda "I" Lease, Well No. 4 and in support thereof furnishes the following facts:

The J. F. Janda "I" Lease, Well No. 4 is located 660 feet from the north and east lines of Section 2, T-23-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico. This well was completed on July 22, 1958, as an oil well in the Langlie-Mattix Pool. The well tested 417 barrels of oil in twenty-four hours with a gas volume of 145 MCF. The estimated volume of casinghead gas to be produced during August, 1958, is 12 MCF per day based on an allowable of 35 barrels and a gas-oil ratio of 348 cubic feet per barrel.

There is no low pressure gas gathering system located on this lease since J. F. Janda "I" Wells Nos. 1 and 2 produce high pressure Jaland Gas. However, we are in the process of obtaining a market for the low pressure gas. The nearest low pressure gas gathering system, located a distance of approximately three-fourths of a mile, is owned by Phillips Petroleum Company.

In view of the foregoing information and in order to keep this well on production and thereby protect correlative rights,

that the Oil Conservation Commission issue an exception to its No-Flare Order R-553 with respect to a casinghead gas volume of approximately 12 MCF per day from the J. F. Janda "I" Lease, Well No. 4. It is desired that such an exception be granted for an indefinite period pending contractual negotiations and the completion of facilities required to gather the gas.

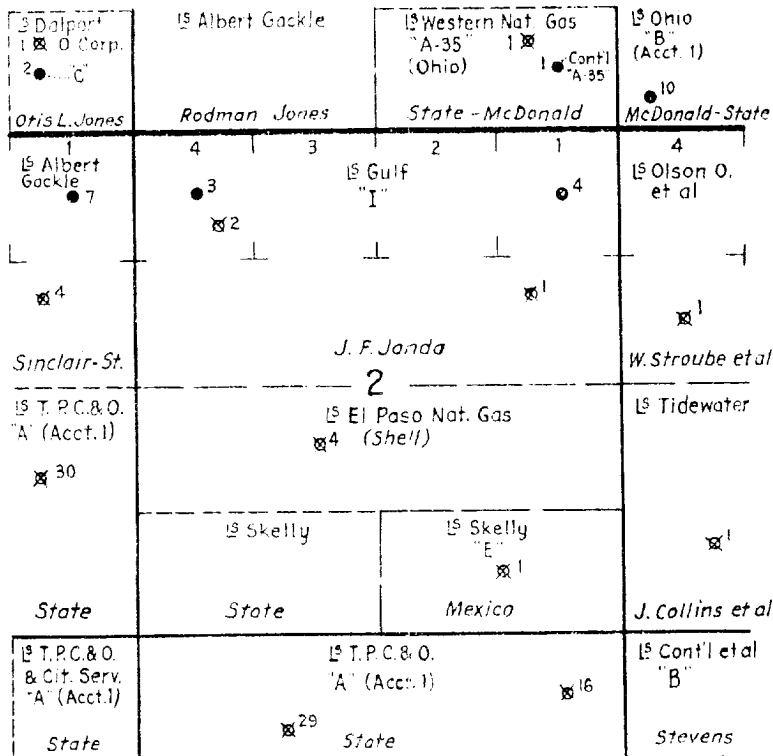
