Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation respectfully requests that the Oil Conservation Commission grant an exception to No-Flare Order R-553 insofar as it pertains to Gulf's J. F. Janda "I" Lease, Well No. 5 and in support thereof furnishes the following facts:

The J. F. Janda "I" Lease, Well No. 5 is located 660 feet from the north line and 1980 feet from the west line of Section 2, T-23-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico. This well was completed on September 4, 1958, as an oil well in the Langlie-Mattix Pool. The well tested 76 barrels of oil in twenty-four hours with a gas volume of 797 MCF. The estimated volume of casinghead gas to be produced during November, 1958, is 428 MCF per day based on an allowable of 37 barrels and a gas-oil ratio of 11,558 cubic feet per barrel.

There is no low pressure gas gathering system located on this lease since J. F. Janda "I" Wells Nos. 1 and 2 produce high pressure Jalmat Gas. However, we are in the process of obtaining a market for the low pressure gas. The nearest low pressure gas gathering system, located a distance of approximately three-fourths of a mile, is owned by Phillips Petroleum Company.

In view of the foregoing information and in order to keep this well on production and thereby protect correlative rights, it

Gulf Oil Corporation respectfully requests that the Oil Conservation Commission grant an exception to No-Share Order R-253 insofar as it pertains to Gulf's U. F. Lands "I" Lease, Well No. 2 and in support thereof furnishes the following facts:

The U. F. Lands "I" Lease, Well No. 2 is located 600 feet from the north line and 1280 feet from the west line of Section 2, T-23-S, R-24-E, Lem County, New Mexico. This well was completed on September 4, 1928, as an oil well in the Matlin Pool. The well tested to barrels of oil in twenty-four hours with a gas volume of 707 MCF. The estimated volume of saturated gas to be produced during November, 1928, is 428 MCF per day based on an allowance of 37 barrels and a gas-oil ratio of 11,228 cubic feet per barrel.

There is no low pressure gas gathering system located on this lease since U. F. Lands "I" Wells Nos. 1 and 2 produce high pressure natural gas. However, we are in the process of obtaining a market for the low pressure gas. The nearest low pressure gas gathering system, located a distance of approximately three-fourths of a mile, is owned by Phillips Petroleum Company.
