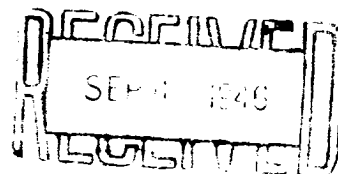

Company or Operator Lease

NE/4 of Sec. 21, T. 23 S, R. 36 E, N. M. P. M.,
Cooper-Jal Field, Lea County.

The dates of this work were as follows: Perforated from 3530 to 3425 on Feb. 20, 1946

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

In an effort to obtain gas for production of well and operation of lease, the 5-1/2" casing was perforated by Lane Wells from 3530 to 3425 in the Seven Rivers formation. The well was tested throughout 1946 until July. Well would flow water only, with coloring of oil, through 3/4" choke, and died frequently. By July, 1946, the well was dead, and it has been decided to temporarily abandon the lease - wells 1 and 2.

Production before perforating: 1 bbl oil and 100 bbl water daily.

Production after perforating: Well dead.
