Report of the Commission
on the Conservation of Oil

Presented to the
Governor of New Mexico

By the Commission

The Commission was organized by the Governor of New Mexico in 1942 to study the oil resources of the State and to recommend measures for their conservation. The Commission has since that time held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the public. It has also conducted extensive research into the oil industry and the conservation of oil resources. The following report is a summary of the Commission's findings and recommendations.

The Commission believes that the oil resources of New Mexico are of great importance to the State and to the Nation. It believes that these resources should be conserved and that measures should be taken to prevent their depletion.

The Commission recommends that the following measures be taken:

1. That the State should acquire a controlling interest in the oil resources of the State.

2. That the State should regulate the production of oil.
