

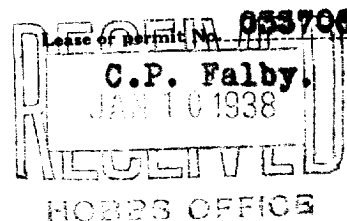

Total depth 3760' Line.

Shot well with 450 quarts of nitroglycerine from 3584' to 3760' on 12-16-37. The shot was tamped with 39 feet of gravel.

Before shooting the well flowed 13 bbls. oil in 5 hours on 12-13-37. After shooting and cleaning out to bottom the well flowed 76 bbls. of fluid (4% BSAW) thru 3/4" choke in 24 hours; on 1-7-38.
