Dear Mr. Scarbrough:

Your letter of May 9 has been received and reviewed together with the well's history. We note that the February 1988 schedule showed the well to be nearly eight times overproduced and that the May schedule shows it to be 15.8 times overproduced, as of March 31. Furthermore, the January 22, 1988 memorandum stated as follows:

"...excessively overproduced wells are to be produced only during and to the extent necessary to meet the emergency demand. Excessively overproduced wells will be curtailed or shut-in after March 31, 1988 to help bring prorated pools into balance."

It is pointed out that there has been nothing from this office which would lead you to believe that production during the emergency would be exempt from allowables. You produced your well, probably at premium gas prices, and are therefore considerably better off than your neighbors.

As provided in Rule 11(c) of Order R-8170, you are hereby authorized to produce not more than $250 \, \text{MCF}$ per month until the subject well is less than $\overline{\text{six}}$ times $\overline{\text{overproduced}}$.
