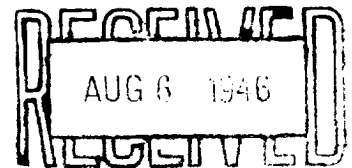

FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

5 1/2" fifteen and one-half pound casing was cemented at 5189' with 600 sacks on August 2, 1946. Plug was pumped down at 8:45 A.M.

Cement will be allowed 48 hours set time before being drilled to a depth within the casing approximately 4 feet above the shoe. An electric log will then be run from 3800' to total depth and casing will be perforated opposite the pay sections.
