## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

5 1/2" casing; 15 1/2 pound; was cemented at 6372' with 350 sacks on November 19, 1948. Plug was pumped down at 9:30 A.M. Cement was allowed a set time of 72 hours. Hole was then entered with 2" tubing and casing pressure tested. Same was found to be O. K. Cement was drilled out of casing by the conventional circulation method and then the circulatory system was rigged up to drill formation by the Reverse Circulation method.
