Dear Mr. Furr:

After making a check of your R. E. Cole No. 1 in Unit O and No. 2 in Unit N of Section 16, T-22-S, R-37-E, we find these wells to be producing from the Grayburg formation rather than the Queen as shown on Forms C-104. This will place them in the Penrose Skelly Pool rather than the Eumont Pool and beginning March 1, 1957 they will be carried there in the Oil Proration Schedule.

Please file Form C-110 for each well showing the new pool designation.

We also wish to call to your attention that we have not as yet received a copy of an electrical log for either of these wells.
