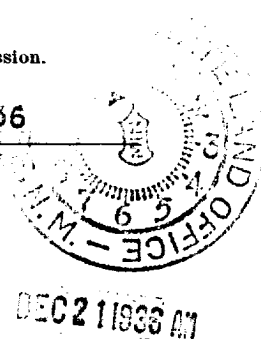

REPORT FOR FEBRUARY TO CORRESPONDENTS WITH THE NEW

The following is a summary of the reports received from the various correspondents for the month of February.

1. *Dr. J. H. Smith*, Chicago, Ill., reports a case of acute inflammation of the lungs, with a high fever and a cough producing copious sputum. The patient died on the fifth day of the illness.

3. *Dr. C. D. Brown*, Philadelphia, Pa., reports a case of acute inflammation of the liver, with a high fever and a jaundice. The patient died on the seventh day of the illness.

4. *Dr. E. F. White*, Boston, Mass., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the kidneys, with a history of back pain and hematuria. The patient died on the twelfth day of the illness.

5. *Dr. G. H. Black*, St. Louis, Mo., reports a case of acute inflammation of the bladder, with a high fever and a pain in the lower abdomen. The patient died on the eighth day of the illness.

6. *Dr. I. J. Green*, Cincinnati, O., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the heart, with a history of palpitation and dyspnea. The patient died on the ninth day of the illness.

7. *Dr. K. L. Hall*, San Francisco, Cal., reports a case of acute inflammation of the intestines, with a high fever and a diarrhea. The patient died on the sixth day of the illness.

8. *Dr. M. N. King*, Portland, Me., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the lungs, with a history of cough and sputum. The patient died on the eleventh day of the illness.

9. *Dr. O. P. Lee*, New Orleans, La., reports a case of acute inflammation of the spleen, with a high fever and a pain in the upper abdomen. The patient died on the seventh day of the illness.

10. *Dr. Q. R. Miller*, Detroit, Mich., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the pancreas, with a history of abdominal pain and vomiting. The patient died on the tenth day of the illness.

11. *Dr. S. T. Moore*, Kansas City, Mo., reports a case of acute inflammation of the gallbladder, with a high fever and a pain in the right upper abdomen. The patient died on the eighth day of the illness.

12. *Dr. U. V. Taylor*, Little Rock, Ark., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the thyroid gland, with a history of swelling of the neck and difficulty in swallowing. The patient died on the ninth day of the illness.

13. *Dr. W. X. Young*, Memphis, Tenn., reports a case of acute inflammation of the testis, with a high fever and a pain in the scrotum. The patient died on the seventh day of the illness.

14. *Dr. Y. Z. Adams*, Louisville, Ky., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the uterus, with a history of irregular menstruation and pelvic pain. The patient died on the tenth day of the illness.

15. *Dr. A. B. Baker*, Nashville, Tenn., reports a case of acute inflammation of the prostate gland, with a high fever and a pain in the perineum. The patient died on the eighth day of the illness.

16. *Dr. C. D. Carter*, Richmond, Va., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the bladder, with a history of frequency of urination and pain. The patient died on the eleventh day of the illness.

17. *Dr. E. F. Evans*, Washington, D. C., reports a case of acute inflammation of the ovary, with a high fever and a pain in the lower abdomen. The patient died on the seventh day of the illness.

18. *Dr. G. H. Fisher*, New Haven, Conn., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the fallopian tube, with a history of pelvic pain and infertility. The patient died on the ninth day of the illness.

19. *Dr. I. J. Gibson*, Hartford, Conn., reports a case of acute inflammation of the uterus, with a high fever and a pain in the lower abdomen. The patient died on the eighth day of the illness.

20. *Dr. K. L. Hall*, Providence, R. I., reports a case of chronic inflammation of the vagina, with a history of discharge and itching. The patient died on the tenth day of the illness.
