MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS OF CASES

REPORT OF A CASE OF ACUTE INTERSTITIAL NEPHRITIS
 WITH HEMATURIA AND CYSTALURIA
 J. H. HARRIS, M.D., CHICAGO, ILL.
 (Received for publication, June 10, 1914.)

The following case is one of the many which are being reported from the United States and Europe, and which are characterized by the presence of hematuria and cysturia.

The patient, a man, aged 45, was admitted to the hospital on June 10, 1914, with the complaint of hematuria and cysturia.

The history of the case is as follows: The patient had been in good health until about six months ago, when he began to experience some discomfort in the lower back and a feeling of fullness in the bladder.

At this time he noticed some blood in his urine, and a few days later he began to pass small, white, sandy concretions in his urine.

He consulted a physician, who advised him to rest and to drink plenty of water. He also prescribed some medicine, but the patient did not improve.

He then came to the hospital, where he was admitted to the ward. On admission, the following physical examination was made:

General: Well developed, middle-aged man, no remarkable features.

Head: Normal.

Neck: Normal.

Chest: Normal.

Abdomen: Normal.

Genitalia: Normal.

Rectum: Normal.

Urinary system: Normal.

Respiratory system: Normal.

Circulatory system: Normal.

Digestive system: Normal.

Genitourinary system: Normal.

Neurological system: Normal.

Psychic system: Normal.

Summary: The patient is a man, aged 45, with a history of hematuria and cysturia. The physical examination is normal.

Diagnosis: Acute interstitial nephritis.

Prognosis: Good.

Treatment: Rest, plenty of water, and some medicine.
