DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

6482' Drilled Out Depth. Reperforated 5 1/2" casing 6445'-6450', 20 shots. Dumped 28 gals. pea gravel 6482' - 6454' and ran 4 gals. plastic for cap. Top cap at 6450'. Dumped 5 gals. plastic, pressured up with 1100#, top at 6445'. Pressures up with 1600# and top at 6449'. Dumped 5 gals. plastic, pressured up with 1800# and found top at 6444', 7:05AM, 9-13-48. At 6:00PM, ran thief and top plastic at 6445'. Ran 207 jts. 2-3/8" OD tubing, Guiberson Hookwall Packer and 1-3' perf. sub on bottom of tbg. Displaced water with oil and set packer at 6370', tbg. at 6439'. Started swabbing and in 22 hrs. to 6AM, 9-15-48, swabbed 142.90 bbls. fluid, 34.4% water, little gas. In next 24 hrs. swabbed 65.55 bbls. fluid, 31% water, little gas.
