FOLLOW INSTRUCTIONS IN THE RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSION

A string of 5½" casing, composed of 3200' of 17# and 3165' of 15½#, was cemented at 6365' with 400 sacks. Plug was pumped down at 7:00 P.M. A temperature survey was run on March 8, 1946 after cement had set 24 hours and top of cement was found at 5020'.

Casing will be pressure tested and cement drilled from hole on March 10, 1946. Present total depth of hole is 6419'.
