A P P L I C A T I O N

Comes now ANDERSON-PRICHARD OIL CORPORATION, and in support of its Application, states:

1. Applicant is the operator of the No. 1 Lee well located 3300 feet from the North Line and 660 feet from the East Line of Section 23, Township 22 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

2. The well was drilled to a total depth of 6441 feet and was completed on October 28, 1945, seven inch OD casing being set at 6340 feet. The well is currently producing oil from the Drinkard formation through open hole from 6340 feet to 6441 feet.

3. Applicant proposes to dually complete the well as follows:

- (a) Perforate the seven inch casing between 5380 feet and 5460 feet in the Blinebry gas zone.
- (b) Set a production type packer below these perforations at a depth of approximately 5510 feet.
- (c) Produce the oil from the Drinkard formation through the tubing and the gas from the Blinebry formation through the annular space between the tubing and the casing.

4. The dual completion of the well in the above described manner is mechanically feasible and practical and is in the interest of conservation and the protection of correlative rights.

5. If the Application is granted, applicant will comply with the applicable rules of the Commission relating to the separation of production from the two formations.


