

and regulations of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission to maintain separation of production from the two pay zones.

(f) That the manner and method of the proposed dual completion is mechanically feasible and practical.

(g) That by copy of this letter of application, all offset operators are notified of the proposed dual completion.

(h) That this well is less than one mile outside the limits of the Tubb Gas Pool. In the event that a commercial gas well from the Tubb pay is obtained, it will be requested that the limits of the Tubb Gas Pool be extended to include this well.

Therefore, Western Oil Fields, Inc., requests that the Commission grant permission to the applicant to dually complete the subject well as proposed in this application.
