Dear Mr. Porter:

Mr. Randall Montgomery, Production Manager of Hobbs District, has informed me of the fact that we, the Western Oil Fields, Inc., must apply for a "No-Flare" order to comply with provisions set forth in Commission Order R-410.

The lease concerned is our Shell Stake #1 in Unit B of Section 36, T22S, R37E, McKinley Oil Pool, Lee County, New Mexico.

We have no pipeline connection on the lease because the volume of casinghead gas from the well is too low for economic purposes. We only produce approximately 5 barrels of oil per day at a 25,000 to 1 ratio. The 125.0 MCF of gas and the 5 barrels of oil are produced in about one hour of flaring time per day.

By experimenting with flow conditions we have found this the best method of producing the well.

Would you please let me know the procedures for obtaining the "No-Flare" order.
