Gentlemen:

Texas Pacific Oil Company respectfully requests an exception to Rule 5 (A) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Jalmat Gas Pool of Order No. R-1670 for the formation of a 160 acre non-standard gas proration unit for its State "A" A/c-1, Well No. 104 located 1650' from the South line and 1980' from the West line of Section 9, Township 23 South, Range 36 East, Jalmat Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

The proposed unit is to consist of the SW/4 of Section 9 presently dedicated to State "A" A/c-1, Well No. 9 (660' from the South line and 660' from the West line). Texas Pacific Oil Company seeks to abolish the above described non-standard gas and re-dedicate this same 160 acre unit to State "A" A/c-1, Well No. 104.

In support of this request the following facts are submitted:

1. Well No. 9 can no longer efficiently and economically produce due to water encroachment in the well.
2. The proposed 160 acre non-standard gas proration unit for Well No. 104 consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections.
3. Said unit lies wholly within a single governmental section.
4. The entire unit may reasonably be presumed to be productive of gas from the Jalmat Gas Pool.
5. The length or width of the unit does not exceed 2640 feet.
6. There are no other operators owning interest in Section 9 containing said non-standard proration unit and there are no offset operators within 1500 feet of the well, however, all operators offsetting the said non-standard gas proration unit have been notified by copy of this application in registered mail.
