Additional Determinations & Remarks

These waters show characteristics that are reasonably similar to one another although the sample from Sims Fed. #1 does show a slightly higher level of calcium and bicarbonate. When we compare these waters with our records, we find a wide variety of salt levels in Drinkard and Abo waters in this area, but these two records are somewhat similar to some of our records of Drinkard water. Unfortunately, our records range from 10-15 miles distance from these wells.
