Gentlemen:

On January 11, 1984, the New Mexico Oil Conservation Division convened the final nomenclature committee meeting. The committee accomplished its goal to standardize the formation tops in the Delaware Basin in Lea County, New Mexico, for the Bell Canyon, Cherry Canyon, Brushy Canyon, Bone Spring, Strawn, Atoka and Morrow formations.

The final cross sections will be incorporated into the pool rules of the OCD study area. This will be accomplished at the Examiner Hearing for February 29, 1984. At this hearing we will seek three exceptions for wells which cross the proposed boundaries, one well reclassification of its producing interval, the abolishment of three pools, the creation of two new pools, and the extension of one pool.


According to our records your State 23 Well #2-F (1980/N & W) of Section 23, T23S, R34E, is completed as follows: Atoka & Morrow dual completion  
Atoka Perfs 12033-052' & 12796-802'  
Packer -- 13006'  
Morrow perfs 13232-298'  
Nomenclature Morrow top -- 12764'

In order to avoid the relocation of the packer in this well, an exception will be granted allowing the well to remain as it now is.

According to our records your State 23 Well #1-N in Sec. 23, T23S, R34E, is now classified as an Antelope Ridge Atoka Gas well with perfs at 12903-21'. The nomenclature Morrow top is at 12873' which is higher than your perfs of 12903-21', therefore this well will be reclassified from Antelope Ridge Atoka to Antelope Ridge Morrow.

The final cross sections will be available in Hobbs from Superior Reproductions at (505) 393-4061. Please review the above and inform us in writing whether or not you are in agreement with the proposed grandfathered-in exception and pool change outlined in this letter.
