Gentlemen:

Texas Pacific Oil Company, Inc., respectfully requests administrative approval to redistribute dedicated gas acreage on our State "A" A/C-1 Lease, Jalmat Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, in the following described nonstandard gas units. By so doing, this will afford Texas Pacific Oil Company, Inc., an opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in this pool, and will otherwise prevent waste and protect correlation rights.

- (A) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 24 Unit "N"  
Sec. 24, T23S, R36E. Acreage now assigned to this well is a 160 acre nonstandard gas proration unit comprised of the SW/4 Sec. 24.
- (B) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 25 Unit "F"  
Sec. 24, T23S, R36E. Acreage now assigned to this well is a 160 acre nonstandard gas proration unit comprised of the NW/4 Sec. 24.
- (C) State "A" A/C-1 Well No. 32 Unit "J"  
Sec. 24, T23S, R36E. Acreage now assigned to this well is a 160 acre nonstandard gas proration unit comprised of the SE/4 Sec. 24.

We request administrative approval to create one (1) 480 acre nonstandard gas proration unit comprising of the S/2 of Sec. 24 and the NW/4 of Sec. 24, (see attached plat) and permission to produce the unit allowable from any or all of the said wells in the proposed unit.

Each of the above three 160 acre units is productive of gas and approval of the proposed nonstandard 480 acre proration unit will afford the applicant the opportunity to produce its just and equitable share of the gas in the pool.
