Gentlemen:

Gulf Oil Corporation hereby makes application for approval of a non-standard gas proration unit comprising the NW/4 of the NE/4 Section 35, T-23-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states the following facts:

- (1) Gulf Oil Corporation is owner and operator of an oil and gas lease known as the Manda C. Lease, which is described above.
- (2) The Manda C Well #1 located 680 feet from the North line and 1980 feet from the East line, Section 35, T-23-S, R-36-E, Lea County, New Mexico, was dually completed in the Langlie Mattix Oil Pool and the Jalmat Gas Pool on August 29, 1955, and September 9, 1955, respectively. The completion in the Jalmat Gas Pool was between 2950 feet and 3176 feet, and in the Langlie Mattix Oil Pool was between 3512 feet and 3625 feet. The well flowed 960 MCF per day of gas at a back pressure of 600 psig on the Oil Conservation Commission's 15-minute back pressure test. The applicant proposes to use this well as the Unit well.
- (3) The proposed non-standard gas proration unit will meet the requirements of Rule 5(b) of the Oil Conservation Commission Order No. R-520 as follows:
 - (a) Contiguous quarter-quarter sections will comprise the unit.
