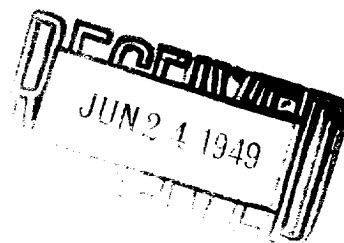

### DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Total depth 1266' anhydrite. Ran 38 Jts. or 1249.70' of 8-5/8" OD 24# 8 HD. J-55 SS casing, set at 1262.30' & cemented with 600 sacks. Plug down at 5:00 PM., 6/20/49. Cement was allowed to set 36 hours, plug drilled out & hole bailed dry. No water came in, in one hour. Picked up drill pipe & drilling was resumed.
