DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Pressure at start 1150# on casing. Bled off and pumped 30 barrels oil down tubing. Pressure fell to zero on tubing. Pumped solution of 600 gallons acid and 1400 gallons water down tubing. Pressure at start 250# and gradually increased to 500# at finish. Pumped 65 barrels of oil down tubing after acid at 400# pressure. Pumped 100 barrels of oil down casing. Pressure at start 1100# and gradually decreased to 175# at finish. 150# pressure on tubing at completion. Well was shut in for 48 hours and when opened up made 620 barrels oil in first 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours.
