T. D. 3244 Lime. Loaded hole with water & introduced 1 bbl. oil & 250 gal. Dowell "X" followed by 1 bbl. oil. Bled 20 bbls. water off casing to spot acid on bottom. Flushed tubing with 20 bbls. water. Let set 1 hour. Unloaded hole with gas lift. Hole dry. Let set 2 hours & circulated gas with recovery of approximately 1/2 bbl. of fluid, approximately 5 gal. of which was cut oil & acid, balance water. Let set 5 hours & tested recovering 1/2 bbl. of same kind of fluid. Well was shut in to prepare for another acid treatment.
