T. D. 3270 Line. With packer set 3258' 3" loaded hole with water & introduced 500 gal. Dowell "X". Bled 19 bbls. water off casing and spotted acid on bottom. Flushed tubing with 20 bbls. water. Let well set 2 hours and used gas lift 1-1/2 hours, produced 160 bbls. acid sludge & water into pits. Next ~~20~~ hours well also on gas lift. Flowed 55 bbls. water, no oil first hour, next 19 hours flowed average 1 bbl. water with slight ~~sum~~ oil hourly. Well tested 72 hours during next three days, produced average 1 bbls. water, slight ~~sum~~ oil hourly. Now shut in to prepare for another treatment.

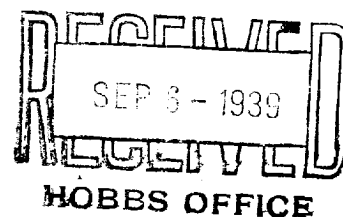
