Gentlemen:

The gas-oil ratio of this well is 1840 feet and the March, 1961, proration schedule indicates an oil allowable of 35 barrels, which results in 64.4 MCF of gas per day being flared.

Attached are three copies of a plat showing the well and tank battery location, offset ownership, and the location of existing gas gathering lines in the vicinity.
