## DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

Hole shot with 140 quarts SNG from 3582' to 3532' and blank anchor used from 3582' to 3602' TD. Unable to tamp shot because pressure would not let tamp go in hole. AG Double Time Bomb used and shot exploded on time. Well flowed estimated 5 barrels per hour before shooting. From December 29th to January 19th was spent cleaning out after shot and waiting several days for pipe line connections which were late in being made due to the fact that the pipe line company had to lower their gathering system in this area. 2" tubing set at 3596' and in 20 hour test well flowed 127 barrels oil; flowed 18 hours thru 16/64 choke with CP-560 and TP-250 and flowed 2 hours thru 30/64 choke with CP-400 and TP-100. **DUPLICATE**
