Gentlemen:

Comes now Skelly Oil Company a Delaware Corporation, with
offices in Tulsa, Oklahoma and Hobbs, New Mexico, hereby petitioning
the Secretary of the New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission for
administrative approval for an exception to Order No. R-553 as
pertaining to the flaring of gas in the Langlie Mattix Pool, Lea
County, New Mexico; and in support thereof wishes to make the
following statements:

1. That the petitioner is the operator of a 480 acre
lease known as its Harrison "B" Lease, located in the W/2 of Section
9 and the SE/4 of Section 5, T 23 S, R 37 E in the Langlie Mattix
pool, Lea County, New Mexico.

2. That the petitioner is the operator of the well
listed below:

<u>LEASE & WELL NO.</u>	<u>FLARED GAS VOLUME</u>	<u>GOR</u>
Harrison "B" 9	57 MCFPD	1630

3. That arrangements are being made for the installation
of casinghead gas connections.

4. That a plat showing offset ownership, well and tank
battery location has been prepared and is true and correct to the
best of our knowledge.

5. That all provisions of paragraph 10, Order No. R-520
have been complied with as pertaining to the filing of form C-110
on the wells listed above.

WHEREFORE, in order to prevent undue hardship and protect
correlative rights, the petitioner requests that the Secretary of the
Commission grant an exception to Order No. R-553, whereby the
petitioner may flare gas from the above wells until arrangements have
been completed for the installation of casinghead gas connections.

1. The first part of the document is a letter from the President of the United States to the Congress, dated January 1, 1861. 
