# MULTI-POINT SURFACE USE AND OPERATIONS PLAN Yates Petroleum Corporation

Dean "APQ" Federal #1 2310' FSL and 2310' FEL Sec. 3-T.26S-R.34E Lea County, New Mexico

This plan is submitted with Form 3160-3, Application for Permit to Drill, covering the above described well. The purpose of this plan is to describe the location of the proposed well, the proposed construction activities and operations plan, the magnitude of the surface disturbance involved and the procedures to be followed in rehabilitating the surface after completion of the operations, so that a complete appraisal can be made of the environmental effect associated with the operations.

## 1. EXISTING ROADS:

Exhibit A is a portion of the BLM map showing the well and roads in the vicinity of the proposed location. The proposed wellsite is located approximately 70 miles East of Carlsbad, New Mexico and the access route to the location is indicated in red and green on Exhibit A.

#### DIRECTIONS:

Go east of Carlsbad on Hwy 285 to Hwy 31. Go east on Hwy 31 to Hwy 128 (Jal Hwy). go approximately 38.5 miles to County Road C-2. Turn south and follow C-2 for approximately 13.2 miles to caliche pipeline/Lease Road. Turn east and go approximately 5 miles to old lease road going north. Turn north for approximately 0.4 of a mile. New access will start here and go east to the well pad.

## 2. PLANNED ACCESS ROAD

- A. The proposed new access will be approximately 750' in length from the point of origin to the southwest corner of the drilling pad. The road will lie in a easterly direction.
- B. The new road will be 14 feet in width (driving surface) and will be adequately drained to control runoff and soil erosion.
- C. The new road will be bladed with drainage on both sides. No traffic turnouts will be built.
- D. The route of the road is visible.
- E. Existing roads will be maintained in the same or better condition.

# 3. LOCATION OF EXISTING WELL

- A. There is drilling activity within a one-mile radius of the wellsite.
- B. Exhibit D shows existing wells within a one-mile radius of the proposed wellsite.
