ANNUAL REPORT OF THE COMMISSIONER OF THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE

The General Land Office is a bureau of the Department of the Interior, and is charged with the management of the public lands of the United States. It is the largest land-owning agency in the country, and its lands are found in every State and Territory. The Office is organized into several divisions, each of which is responsible for a particular phase of the land management program. The divisions are: the Surveying Division, the Mining Division, the Reclamation Division, the Conservation Division, and the Administration Division. Each division is headed by a Chief, who is responsible for the management of the division's affairs. The Chief of the Surveying Division is the Surveyor General, who is responsible for the surveying of the public lands. The Chief of the Mining Division is the Mining Commissioner, who is responsible for the management of the mining lands. The Chief of the Reclamation Division is the Reclamation Commissioner, who is responsible for the management of the reclamation lands. The Chief of the Conservation Division is the Conservation Commissioner, who is responsible for the management of the conservation lands. The Chief of the Administration Division is the Administration Commissioner, who is responsible for the management of the administrative lands.
