## MISCELLANEOUS REPORTS ON WELLS

Submit this report in duplicate to the State Geologist or proper Oil and Gas Inspector within ten days after the work specified is completed. It should be signed and sworn to before a notary public for reports on beginning drilling operations, results of shooting well, results of test of water shut-off, result of abandonment of well, and other important operations, even though the work was witnessed by the State Geologist or Oil and Gas Inspector. Reports on minor operations need not be signed and sworn to before a notary public, but such operations should be witnessed by an Oil and Gas Inspector if possible.

1. The first step in the process of the investigation is the identification of the problem. This is done by the investigator who is assigned to the case. The investigator must first determine the nature of the problem and the scope of the investigation. This is done by interviewing the complainant and the accused, and by reviewing the evidence. The investigator must also determine the jurisdiction of the investigation and the applicable laws. Once the problem has been identified, the investigator must then develop a plan of action. This plan should include the objectives of the investigation, the methods to be used, and the timeline for the investigation. The investigator must also identify the resources that will be needed for the investigation. Once the plan of action has been developed, the investigator must then implement the plan. This involves conducting interviews, gathering evidence, and analyzing the information. The investigator must also keep the complainant and the accused informed of the progress of the investigation. Finally, the investigator must prepare a report of the findings of the investigation. This report should include a summary of the facts, the results of the investigation, and the recommendations for further action. The report should also be submitted to the appropriate authorities for their review and approval.
