DETAILS OF WORK

The subject well is presently producing a small amount of gas through 7" casing perforations from 2940 to 2960 with a plugged back total depth of 3065'.

In an attempt to obtain oil production, it is proposed to perforate 7" casing from approximately 3034 to 3044', acidize through perforations and produce with a packer set at approximately 3008'.

In the event that this interval should prove unproductive it is further proposed to plug back and test the Yates formation by perforating intervals from approximately 2941' to 3008' as determined by radioactivity log.

I understand that this plan of work must receive approval in writing by the Geological Survey before operations may be commenced.
