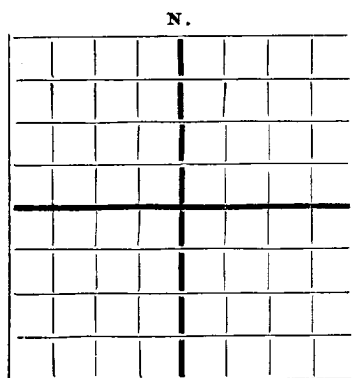

One copy will be returned following approval.
