Re: Continental Oil Company Application for a 40-Acre Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit for its Jack Federal 19 Well No. 4 in Section 19, T-24S, R-37E, NMPM, Jalmat Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico

Continental Oil Company respectfully requests administrative approval under the provisions of Rule 5(c) of the Special Rules and Regulations for the Jalmat Gas Pool of Order No. R-1670 for the formation of a 40-acre non-standard gas proration unit consisting of NE/4 NW/4 Section 19, T-24S, R-37E, for its Jack Federal 19 Well No. 4, located 990 feet from the north line and 1587 feet from the west line of Section 19, T-24S, R-37E, Lea County, New Mexico, in the Jalmat Gas Pool.

In support of this request we should like to point out that the proposed unit conforms with the requirements of said Rule 5(c) in all respects as follows:

1. Said proposed non-standard gas proration unit consists of one quarter-quarter section.

2. Said proposed non-standard gas proration unit lies wholly within a single governmental section.

3. The entire proposed non-standard gas proration unit may be reasonably presumed to be productive of gas.

4. The length or width of said unit does not exceed 5.280 feet.

5. A copy of this application has been sent to all operators in the same section or within 1,500 feet of said well.

6. The Jack Federal 19 No. 4 was producing as an oil well in the Jalmat Pool until September 1, 1964, when the NMCCC reclassified the well as a gas well due to high gas-oil ratio.
