November 18, 1943, shot well with 160 Qts. Nitroglycerin from 3380' to 3486', 13-3" x 8' Bakelite Shells, AG Time Bomb, Bolshevik Cave Catcher, packed with 1 Yard Pea Gravel and cleaned out to bottom and on first 24 hour test on 1/2" Choke made 109.41 Barrels Oil with Casing Pressure 325# and Tubing Pressure 170# and did not Measure volume of gas.

On 24 hour test on October 2, 1943 on 15/64" Choke made 20.74 Barrels of Oil with Casing Pressure 250# Tubing Pressure 100#, Volume of gas 38,946 000 4,235
