Proposed to set a cement retainer in the 7" Casing just above the casing seat and squeeze cement open hole below the retainer. The casing will then be blown dry with gas and the casing gun perforated from 3120' to 3170' in an effort to obtain gas production from a section 3130' to 3150' which showed best porosity on well log.
