Gentlemen:

New Mexico Oil Conservation Commission Order No. DC-173, dated December 16, 1954, granted Phillips Petroleum Company approval to dually complete its M. C. Woolworth Well No. 4 located in the NW/4 SE/4 of Section 33, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.

This well is to be recompleted as a dual oil-gas well in such a manner as to permit production of gas from the Yates-Seven Rivers formation of the Jalmat Gas Pool and oil from the Queen formation of the Langlie-Mattix Oil Pool.

In accordance with the provisions of the Commission's Order No. R-520, Case No. 673, dated August 12, 1954, we now request administrative approval of a 320 acre non-standard gas proration unit attributable to our M. C. Woolworth Well No. 4 as shown on the attached plat. This proposed unit will comprise the East Half of Section 33, Township 24 South, Range 37 East, Lea County, New Mexico.
