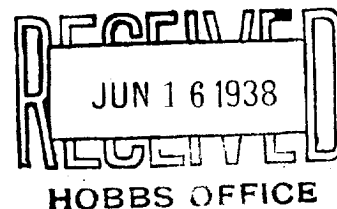

THE COMMISSION ON THE STATUS OF THE NATION, created by the President of the United States, has the honor to submit to you its report.

It is a privilege to have the opportunity to present to you the results of the work of the Commission.

The Commission was organized on June 1, 1959, and has since that time been engaged in a study of the problems of the Nation. It has held numerous public hearings and has received many suggestions from the people of the United States. It has also conducted extensive research into the various fields of the Nation's life.

The Commission has found that the Nation is facing a number of serious problems. These problems are of such a nature that they require the attention of the Nation's leaders and the people. The Commission believes that it is its duty to bring these problems to the attention of the Nation and to suggest ways in which they may be solved.

The Commission believes that the Nation is capable of solving these problems. It believes that the people of the United States are capable of making the decisions that are necessary to bring about a better future for the Nation. It believes that the Nation's leaders are capable of providing the leadership that is necessary to bring about these changes.
