Olsen respectfully request administrative approval under the provisions of Rule 5 (b) of Order No. R-520 of a Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit of 160.00 acres, more or less, comprising the SE/4 of Section 5, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M., Jalmat Gas Pool, Lea County, New Mexico, and in support thereof states the following facts:

1. El Paso Natural Gas Company holds the gas operating rights under the SE/4 of Section 5, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M. That R. Olsen, the owner of the oil rights thereunder, drilled the Wells #1 Well and completed it as a gas well in the Jalmat Gas Pool. El Paso Natural Gas Company has contracted with R. Olsen to purchase said well.

2. That the R. Olsen Wells #1 Well was drilled to a total depth of 3575 feet but was plugged back to 3295 feet on the NE/4 SE/4 of Section 5, Township 25 South, Range 37 East, N.M.P.M. and completed on December 15, 1955, with an initial potential of 21,000 MCF absolute open flow. This well is located 660 feet from the east line, and 1980 feet from the south line of said Section 5.

3. That the proposed Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit will meet the requirements of Rule 5 (b) of Order R-520 in that the proposed unit consists of contiguous quarter-quarter sections within a single governmental section, that the length or width thereof does not exceed 5280 feet, and that the entire area of the proposed unit lies within the horizontal limits of the Jalmat Gas Pool and may reasonable be presumed to be productive of gas. 4. That by a copy of this Letter of Application, all of the other operators owning an interest in the section in which the proposed Non-Standard Proration Unit is situated and all operators owning an interest within 1500 feet of the well have by registered mail been notified.

5. That a plat showing the acreage to be dedicated to the proposed Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit, the location of the said well, and the offset ownership is attached hereto.

6. El Paso Natural Gas Company wishes to advise the Commission that it is its intention to use this well as the unit well.

In view of the existence of the facts herein stated and in compliance with the provisions of Rule 5 (b) of Order No. R-520, El Paso Natural Gas Company requests Administrative approval of said proposed 160-acre Non-Standard Gas Proration Unit.
