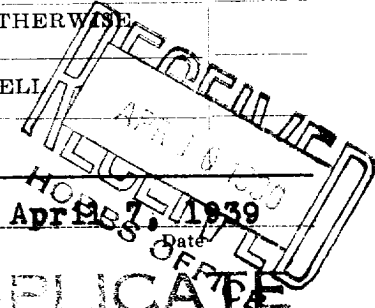

DETAILED ACCOUNT OF WORK DONE AND RESULTS OBTAINED

T.D. 3525 Lime. Ran in 390 qts. SNG in 13- 5" x 8" Risonite shells from 3525' to 3420' with AG time bomb set to detonate 9:45 AM March 28, 1939. Tamped shot with 4-1/2 yards gravel from 3420' to 2943'. Shot exploded as per schedule. Went in with drill pipe & found top of tamp at 2955'. Cleaned out with drill pipe to 3515' and set 2" USE tubing at 3483'. Well flowed 205 bbls. oil load in 3-1/2 hours after tubing. 4-3-39 well flowed 187 bbls. oil, no water in 6 hours. Gas measured 745 MCF daily. Gas-Oil ratio 996.
